## *"Busy Bees"* School Preview & Readiness Program

Busy Bees is a school preview and readiness program where children and parents get a taste of school through participating in exciting and engaging activities that include Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), Literacy, Numeracy, the Creative Arts and Sport.



Children engage with robotics, coding and 3D printing. They become involved in interactive reading and viewing, early numeracy games, creative and practical arts and develop their gross motor control through fun sporting activities. All whilst being part of a group with their Busy Bee t-shirts.

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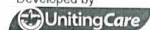
